New Business:

- What is the definition of sports/rec/leisure ???

We have been asked by SORB to help them define sports clubs and recreation/leisure student orgs. Also by GSB Finance committee.

- Here is what I have heard:
 - Recreation Clubs
 - Activity if the only participation is within ISU orgs.
 - Recreation clubs are student run clubs that share and partake in a certain interest or hobby. This is a fairly broad category that includes the majority of clubs here on campus, including in my opinion some of those clubs currently found in the SCC. This would only not include those clubs with a major basis or career application and sport clubs but all others.
 - I think the two clubs are closely related. The main difference is that a rec club is strictly based on having fun. There isn't as much of a competitive feel to it as in a sports club.
 - Is a haphazard organization whose competition is minimal with all different skill levels. There is no striving to get better.
 - Sports Clubs
 - Sport clubs participate in at least one competitive sporting event against another school or non-ISU team.
 - Are those student lead clubs which partake in athletic sports. To me a sport is a competitive group who participates in Olympic recognized sports or those other forms of physical activity which actively competes.
 - A sports club can require attendance for example but a rec club should not really require anything, it's just for fun. Basically, I think a sports club is a little more serious than a rec club.
 - Is an organization that continues to strive to bring the competition to a higher level. Each time they meet it is a personal goal to practice and get better. A sport club will encourage everyone to get better instead of leave a skill level as status quo

Requirements to become a sports club proposal.

- Organization Recognition Requirements

- Proposing: compete annually to be considered a sports club. Otherwise the club will be considered recreation.
 - Do we look at having different levels of recognition in SCC?
 - These levels will help us provide you with better services. For instance, funding, giving more risk management to higher risk clubs. Looking to customize meetings for clubs.
 - What should we require from SCC clubs?
 - Right now it is come to meetings...
- Have a bunch of clubs that are going to be getting money from specials.
 - There are a couple of clubs that seem to have not a lot of current leadership from their executives. If we can help you out in any way please let us know.
