June 3rd – 8th

Located in Northeastern Minnesota, the BWCAW is over one million acres in size; it contains hundreds of lakes and rivers, has 1200 miles of canoe routes, and is home to abundant plants and wildlife, including threatened and endangered species.

The Boundary Waters is a pristine, yet rugged wilderness. The lakes are cut from granite and surrounded in old pine growth. lead climb at the ISU Climbing Wall.


